In the summer of 2011, Sweden will be welcoming 30 000 young Scouts from 150 countries to the World Scout Jamboree. The camp will take place on the fields of Rinkaby outside the city of Kristianstad, where the participants will take part in different activities and have fun and learn many things together. So tonight we have a very Traditional Swedish game enjoyed by many of their cubs and scouts called Kubb.

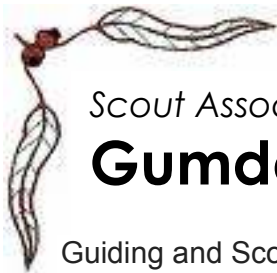
Game Kubb:

The Swedish game of Kubb is know as Viking chess and is played by using the throwing sticks and hitting the Kubb square targets. They must fall over to be counted as out. They must all be knocked over before the King can be knocked over. If the king is knocked over before all the others are that is the end of the game. The opposite team gets to set up the field of play. All throws must be underhand and no side spinning action allowed. The team using the least amount of goes wins.

Discussion: scouts.

The first World Scout Jamboree was organized by **The Boy Scout Association** in London. It was held in 1920 at **the Olympia halls** in **Kensington**, London. Symbolically, the Jamboree site bore the same name of the birthplace of the **Olympic Games**,

With exceptions for the war years, it has been organized approximately every four years, in the more recent years by the **World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM)**, in different locations over the world. A Join-in-Jamboree activity — designed to allow Scouts from around the world to participate in an activity that thousands of other Scouts around the world were also participating in at the same time. The internet site has several of these activities available for this years Jamboree. Australia has hosted a world jamboree in 1987-1988 the 16th in Sydney the theme was Australia Bringing the World together and had 14434 participants. The Swedish **Scout motto** is: "Var redo!" - "Alltid redo!" (**Be Prepared!** - Always prepared!)

Guiding and Scouting have been an active and respected part of Swedish society for almost a hundred years. Every third person of Sweden's nine millions citizens is or has been a guide or scout! Today there are over 100 000 Girl Guides and Boy Scouts in Sweden.

Outdoor life is essential for guides and scouts in Sweden and many activities take place in our beautiful nature. But outdoor life and our other activities are only methods to reach the goal of the Swedish Guide and Scout movement: to develop young people socially, intellectually, spiritually and physically.

For this years world scout Jamboree the theme is "simply scouting" and there 3 important concepts that will be presented.

Meeting.

Encouraging meetings between many different cultures, religions, countries, to help people to get to know who lives outside of their own local community and so that strangers can become friends.

Nature.

It will be close to nature as it is being held in a woodland and will use the natural environment as a learnign tool to see how we can better protect the world we live in.

Solidarity.

It will encourage solidarity between scouts from all over the world and help us see we have a common responsibility to our world and each other. Emphasis equal rights and peace for all.

Sweden.

The last war in which Sweden was directly involved was in 1814, when Sweden by military means forced Norway into a **personal union**. Since then, Sweden has been at peace, adopting a non-aligned foreign policy in peacetime and **neutrality** in wartime.^[14]

Sweden is a **Nordic country** on the **Scandinavian Peninsula** in **Northern Europe**. Sweden shares borders with **Norway** to the west and **Finland** to the east, and is connected to **Denmark** by **Øresund Bridge**. Show map of Sweden

The adventures of many Swedish Vikings are commemorated on **runestones** in Sweden, such as the **Greece Runestones**. Later on we will be doing some Viking craft.

Sweden has a national costume that was officially developed in 1983 after 200 years of discussion and amalgamating many different designs they came up with this! Show photos!

Sweden is an export-oriented **mixed economy** featuring a modern distribution system, excellent internal and external **communications**, and a skilled **labour** force. **Timber**, **hydropower** and **iron ore** constitute the resource base of an economy heavily oriented toward **foreign trade**. Sweden's engineering sector accounts for 50% of output and exports. Telecommunications, the automotive industry and the pharmaceutical industries are also of great importance. Game: crazy knots.

This game is part of the world jamboree join-in program and will be done by thousands of cub scouts across the world.

Rules use your imagination, all cubs in each six must tie at least 1 knot. The six must explain what it is at the end. Knots can be known or unknown but must achieve their purpose and never 25 overhand knots in a row. Have fun and remember each construction must be pulled apart at the end.

Sweden is famous for the popular Smörgåsbord, a large buffet filled with fish, meats, cheeses, salads, omelets, stuffed cabbage and sweets. The midsummer festival is the most popular time for having a smorgasbord.
