Next Week Duty Joey:

Explanation of Activities:

Arrival Stickers: As the Joeys come in, get them to find their travel bag and get their Passport stamped (stickered). Use the Globe to show where they're travelling to.

Colour In: Get the Joeys to colour in a picture of the USA flag.

How Much Further Mr Pilot: Same as What's the time Mr Wolf but Joeys ask "How much further Mr Pilot", answers are eg 2000 km which is 2 steps etc... finishing with "We've arrived."

USA info: Show the Joeys the American Money and discuss about them speaking English and their Population.



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Bison Game: The Joeys will throw spears (skewer with playdough) at pictures of Bison.

Make Native American Headdress: Get the Joeys to make headdress as per the example.

Pass the Wooden Bead Game: The Joeys will sit in a circle with their leader. Hold two wooden beads of different colours in your closed hand. Pass one to the child to your right, without letting the child see which bead you have passed. Ask the child to guess which colour bead has been passed. If the child guesses correctly, give him/her both beads. This child then passes one bead to the next child. That child will guess which colour bead has been passed. If this child guesses correctly, both beads are passed to him/her and the game continues. If the child guesses incorrectly, he/she moves out of the circle and the game continues. Play the game until one child is left in the circle.

Teepee Game: This is a guessing game where one Joey has to guess which teepee the little Indian is hidden in. The leader will ask the joeys to turn around and cover their eyes then place the little Indian under one of the teepees and when they turn around and open their eyes one Joey will be asked to guess which one holds the little Indian. The game continues until each Joey has had a go.

Departure Stickers: The Joeys get a departure Sticker in their passport

Simon Says: Joey Scouts spread out so all can see the Leader. The Leader says "Simon Says (with an action)" Joey Scouts need to the action. If the Leader says to do something without the "Simon Says..." and a Joey does it they are out.



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
